Dear Parents/Carers

The Pupil Premium and Service Premium give schools extra funding to raise the attainment of disadvantaged pupils from reception to year 11. In order to receive this additional funding, we are required to provide information to the Department for Education confirming which children meet the government criteria.

Pupil Premium

If your child is eligible for free school meals or has been in the last 6 years this will generate pupil premium funding for your child's school. To be eligible for free school meals you must be in receipt of the appropriate benefits and have submitted an application for free school meals to the Local Authority Benefits Team.

Do I qualify?

You must be claiming one of the following benefits to qualify for Free School Meals:

• Child Tax Credit with an annual income assessed by HMRC of less than £16,190

(If either you or your partner is entitled to Working Tax Credit you do not qualify for free school meals regardless of income).

- Income-Based Job Seeker's Allowance
- Income-Related Employment Support Allowance
- Universal Credit
- Income Support
- Guarantee Element of State Pension Credit
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration & Asylum Act 1999

If you qualify for the appropriate benefits but have chosen not to apply for free school meals please consider applying. You do not have to take up the free school meal to attract the funding for your child's school.

Service Premium

The Service Premium gives schools extra funding to support children and young people with parents in the armed forces. Pupils attract the premium if they meet the following criteria:

- One of their parents is serving in the regular armed forces
- One of their parents served in the regular armed forces in the last 3 years
- One of their parents died while serving in the armed forces and the pupil is in receipt of a pension under the Armed Forces Compensation Scheme (AFCS) and the War Pensions Scheme (WPS).

If your child meets one of the above Service Premium criteria please let us know as this will enable us to claim this additional funding.

Music News

What a lovely start to the year we've had in Music at Race Leys. So far, our Griffin Children's Chorus has been selected to take part in multiple concerts throughout the year; firstly, at the NCS remembrance event, where our griffins will be joined by Park Lane and Nicholas Chamberlaine School to sing and commemorate those who have fallen in battle. Our next performance will be in December at St Giles, Barbican in London where we will be singing some Christmas songs with all of the other griffin schools. This will be a lovely way to start the festive season.

Finally, we will be returning to the Royal Albert Hall in July alongside the Armonico Consort to perform a selection of songs at this prestigious venue. We are delighted to share with you our partnership with Warwickshire Music Service and the opportunities it gives our griffins. Each child will be learning an instrument alongside their music curriculum. Year 3 will be learning the recorder, year 4 will engage in flute lessons with Miss Moneypenny, year 5 will look at ukulele and year 6 will be able to explore all of these and more. This will be very useful to them for learning new skills in addition to curriculum lessons.

In the curriculum, our Griffins have just finished learning about rhythms of the world in music lessons and it has been delightful to hear them talking about what they have been doing in their lessons. Next half term we will be looking at 'Pitch Perfect' where griffins will be looking at sounds in music and learning about some of the notes.
