### Our Learning Year 3

What an exciting term our year 3 Griffins have had! We had the amazing opportunity of visiting Twycross Zoo, where we saw lots of interesting animals and created magnificent memories. This led to us creating a wonderful fact file recount in English and some textured art images.

In Geography, we researched where animals live, looked at their habitats and created our own information leaflet. Not forgetting Maths, we secured our understanding of equivalent fractions and began our next unit of time. What a busy short half term we have had!





## **Our Learning**

#### Year 4

This half term in English, Griffins have demonstrated their understanding of using sub headings, paragraphs and fronted adverbials by writing a biography on Jacque Cousteau. They have used stimulus from the book 'Man Fish' to write a descriptive setting on what lies beneath the ocean, using adjectives and expanded noun phrases. They have also written a story about a child that goes on an adventure to discover what lies beneath the ocean.

In Maths this half term, Year 4 have completed our learning on decimals and moved on to look at money and time. We are also working extremely hard, practising their times tables for the upcoming multiplication check.

In topic they have studied the layers of the ocean and what lurks beneath. Griffins have identified the continents of the world and the seas and oceans that surround them. They have studied the Great Barrier Reef and identified why the area is changing due to humans and climate change. To strengthen their understanding, they have also visited the Birmingham sea life centre, which was an enjoyable experience for all.

Our Science topic, Living things and their habitats, has fit nicely into our topic this half term. Griffins have completed a local habitat survey and looked at environmental changes that are affecting different animals.

In RE, Griffins have had the opportunity to visit a Mandir, Hindu Temple, in Coventry. This has really helped when comparing the Hindu faith with Christianity. Everyone showed the upmost respect for the faith and asked many interesting questions.

#### Year 5



This term we have been working on the topic of 'Hola Mexico' which is all about the Geography and Culture of Mexico. We have used Google Earth to compare the different environments within Mexico and have investigated the climate in different parts of the country.

We have used Internet research to create information posters and have compared Mexico to the UK. In Art we have designed our own Día de los Muertos (The Day of the Dead) masks using the traditional Mexican designs for inspiration.

We have also used the theme of this year's GAF, 'Change makers', to create a range of artwork for the Birmingham GAF trip competition. Ten lucky winners will be able to take part in a week of Arts related activities staying at Nicholas Chamberlaine school.







The time finally came for our wonderful Griffins to sit their SATs. After months of hard work, they really did showcase all they know and should be incredibly proud of themselves.

We finished the week with an exciting trip to Drayton Manor where all our Griffins and staff had a fantastic time: they showed us their bravery on some of the rides! As well as this, we also travelled down to London where we watched the West End production of Matildaagain another fantastic reward for our Griffins.

In other lessons, Griffins have designed their Day of the Dead masks and have also began learning more about Mexico. In PE, Year 6 took part in International Dance Day and have been working on their cricket skills. They are also working towards Sports Day which I am sure will be a fantastic event.

We are nearly at the end of Year 6 and our Griffins time here at Race Leys Junior School, so we will ensure that Summer 2 is a half term that they will not forget!
